We at Faith Mennonite are grateful to be able to share a week of hosting Goshen Interfaith Hospitality Network with Assembly Mennonite and Walnut Hill Mennonite, which we've done for a number of years. This partnership has allowed us, as a smaller congregation, to be part of this important ministry and to get a glimpse of how it is making a difference in people's lives.

Over the years, we've enjoyed learning to know our guests through sharing meals, playing together and cleaning up together. On occasion, people who have been connected with our congregation and/or our own transitional housing ministry have been GIHN guests, or GIHN guests visited our church at a later time. At other times, conversations have led to serendipitous connections.

On one particular occasion, one of our congregation's GIHN hosts learned in talking with a guest that she was one of her husband's co-workers. It wasn't known in their workplace that the guest and her family were facing the challenges of being homeless. After learning about her situation, the host's husband talked with the guest and asked her permission to invite their colleagues to offer mutual aid, keeping the need anonymous. He noted that in their close-knit work community, he knew people would want to support a colleague if they were aware of a need. He then spoke privately with a Human Resources staff person, who organized a fund drive over the next couple of weeks to help the employee and her family. So a Spirit-led connection made through GIHN resulted in a workplace community also being given the chance to join the circle of support.

This, for us, is an example of the amazing gift that the ministry of GIHN offers: the opportunity to join with others in our community to offer support when it is needed and, by the Spirit's power, to do more together than any of us could do alone. Thanks be to God! And thank you also to the dedicated GIHN staff; we recognize and appreciate your good work.


